The following costs are an estimate of known interactions with services during N's journey:

Presentations at Emergency Department

QLD - \$740 per day x 139 presentations = \$102,860 VIC - \$740 per day x 100 presentations = \$74,000

Corrective Services


\$342.28 per day x 30 days = \$10,268.40

Homelessness support services

\$39.87 per day x 365 days = \$14552.55
